A flurry of activity has occurred among “matters insignia” since the change of General Officers. When Chapter Vice-Presidents are in doubt about what proof is needed to order a certain pin, it is best to call or e-mail to ask before sending an order.

I am concerned about reports that several members have not received previously placed orders. Chapter VP’s cannot report a problem until it is reported to them, but please stay in touch with your Chapter VP and let them know when an order is received. Chapter VP’s can only report on missing orders if they are aware of them.

Chapter VP’s should use the following current insignia forms: Engraved No. 1, dated May 2020; Engraved No. 2, dated March 2013; and Non-Engraved, dated January 2021. A variety of proofs may be needed for certain orders. If in doubt, please call. It is easier to do it right the first time.

This officer looks forward to the District Meetings, and has fingers crossed (it’s an Irish thing) that nothing prevents our being able to meet together as Districts.

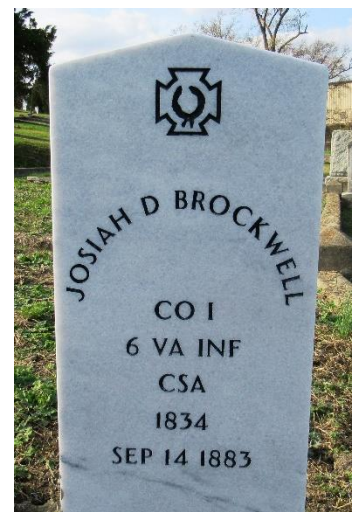
Elliott Grays 1877:

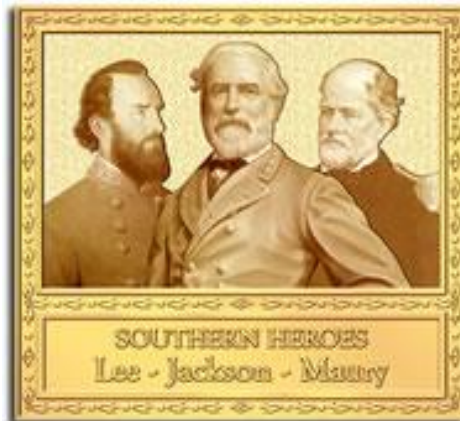
