I will have with me all of the General Insignia forms, the Order for Insignia Placement on the ribbon, and a good supply of the Division Sesquicentennial Pin, \$40.00, and the Virginia Division Badge, \$30.00. So you can purchase the Division pins that day, and place them right on your ribbon.

The Vice President General has sped up the time of orders being returned to the members. I mail every Monday, she receives the order by Thursday, and it is submitted to the engraver within a very short period of time. Approximately two months later, the insignia is delivered. She does not hold orders.

A new UDC Insignia Return Form is now on the UDC General website. This form, along with any insignia that needs to be returned, is submitted directly to the Business Office.

The order form for the new UDC Mini Charm is also on the General Website, and is mailed directly to the Business Office, not to me. Your Chapter does not receive credit for ordering this charm.

Recently Annette Wetzel, Magazine Chairman, sent out a roots web e-mail regarding some upcoming changes for our Magazine. Below are some "highlights" of these changes.

As of the April issue, names of states will be abbreviated to conform to USPS abbreviations.

The complete organization name "United Daughters of the Confederacy" may be used once in an item. Subsequent references within the same item must use the abbreviation "UDC".

Chapter and Division News submission have become unusually lengthy. This is due, in part, to attempts to capture an entire year of activities in a single article. Avoid holding news items. Send them monthly. More inches will be gained by submitting short items monthly than by send one lengthy article occasionally.

The word limit of 350 words is the maximum number allowed for a news item, a "not to exceed" standard.

Write Chapter and Division news with the understanding that all submissions in all categories are edited for content, clarity, accuracy and redundancy.

The UDC Magazine has never accepted material having editorial or publication conditions attached. Any submission received as such will continue to be returned.

### Appomattox Chapter 11 - Appomattox History Weekend

"The Long Road Home" – Appomattox Co. Historical Society, Clover Hill Village, and the United Daughters of the Confederacy Appomattox Chapter 11, Lee's Lieutenants, Inc., and the Federal Generals Corps join together to present a unique opportunity in Civil War living history and reenactment called "The Long Road Home." This five-year series of events, beginning April 8-10, 2011, will honor five major steps along the way to the end of the War Between the States in Virginia, culminating with the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Appomattox in 2015. The yearly events will be held in the beautiful, historic grounds of Appomattox Co. Historical Society, Clover Hill Village. The 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the surrender at Appomattox will be held at a larger site to be announced.

The sponsoring organizations are dedicated to providing a unique experience for reenactors, living historians, and spectators alike in these events. Each weekend will feature battle scenarios centering on the named events, as well as various smaller skirmishes and/or tactical maneuvers surrounding those events. Reenactors and living historians will engage in an unprecedented level of interaction and inclusion of spectators into campaign and battle/tactical planning, camp life, a field aid station where care of the wounded will be demonstrated, ladies' roles during the War including baking hardtack and writing soldiers' letters home, religious services and observances, music, and many other facets of the elements of the lives of Civil War soldiers. Campaigners, or reenactors who seek an extremely high degree of realism, will "camp in the lines" so that spectators can experience the life of soldiers on the battle line, as opposed to in garrison-style camps.

"The Long Road Home" promises to be unlike any other Civil War event, or series of events, as we commemorate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the historic conflict that in many ways defined this country and its future.
