Chapter Treasurers, again I thank you for sending me your per capita tax payments and donations in a timely manner. I very much appreciate your clearly written reports and letters that make my work easier! Your many hours of work for your Chapter are truly a labor of love for the UDC and the memory of our Confederate Ancestors.

Did you mail your Chapter Per Capita Tax report? If not, please do not delay any longer waiting for payments from your tardy members. You can send payment for late payers in a subsequent mailing using another copy of the Treasurer's Remittance Form. Did a member change her mind about resigning this year? Her per capita taxes can still be sent to remove the dropped or resigned status. Please keep in mind the two important deadlines for per capita tax – 1 July and 31 August. After 1 July, a member cannot be included in membership strength for delegates. After 31 August, UDC drops the member and she must be reinstated with additional fees. To insure that payment arrives at the UDC Business Office by these deadlines, please get the payment to me by 24 June and 25 August.

Do you need blank membership cards? Your new supply was in the Per Capita package that you received in November 2012. One of the more joyful duties of the Division Treasurer is counting out all of those little cards! These cards are your supply for next fall for 2013 members. If you need additional cards for this year, please ask me at your District Conference. I will have some with me but if you need them before that please contact me and I will mail you some.

Did you give each new member a membership card? She should receive a membership card for the year that her membership is registered. She paid per capita taxes with her application and that is her first year of membership. The new member should receive her membership card when she receives her membership certificate. Be careful to use the proper years. For example, a member whose membership certificate has a date of 31 August 2012 should receive a membership card dated 2011-2012 even though she would not receive the certificate until we are in the 2012-2013 year.

Treasurer Contact Information. If the Chapter Treasurer has changed or any of your contact information has changed, please, please send me the new or changed contact information. I am not usually informed of elections of the Chapters. To make sure the Division Treasurer can send you the most current information, she must have at the very least a phone number and best is an email address that you check regularly. Emails are the fastest way I can reach the most Treasurer's at a time. This information is never given out by me without your permission.

2013 Annual Chapter Financial Reports are due to me NO LATER than October 31, 2013. Please use the form included in your per capita package. If you need another one, contact me I will either mail or email you one. IRS requires non-profit groups to maintain financial records; this form satisfies that requirement. This UDC form is not optional. Please send it to me by the due date. In addition, I will have forms at District Conferences.

I look forward to being with everyone at District Conferences. Please come! I send my best regards and wishes for a rejuvenating spring to you and yours. I hope to spend some time enjoying some warm weather. I also hope that we do not receive summer temperatures before their time!

REGISTRAR

The Chapter Registrars need to fill out the back of each application with the names of the President General and Virginia Division President and all other spaces required by the Chapter. **PLEASE**, put the applicant's name, Chapter name and number on the back of every piece of proof. This is why proofs get lost and have to be re-submitted.

It is also imperative to connect each generation in all applications by the bloodline.

The Helpful Hints from the Registrar General will be enclosed in the President's Package. Please ask her for them and use them.

I hope the New UDC Handbooks will be available at Spring Board. Please have your chapter President purchase one as soon as they are available. There are many changes since the last printing in 2002, not only for the Registrars, but other offices as well.

If an applicant has had multiple marriages, she **must** submit proof she is the same person as on the Birth Certificate. This can be done by providing all Marriage Certificates along with Death Certificates or Divorce Decrees or a much simpler way is to provide a copy of the Marriage Register that will show the applicants maiden name.

Again, any new member Application or Supplemental Application **MUST** have a Confederate Service Record accompanying the application. This ruling was changed at General Convention in Fort Worth, TX in 2011. If you don't like the ruling of no longer being allowed to grandfather the

service record, submit a bylaw change to General NOW and go to Tulsa and VOTE!

I hope to see each and every Chapter Registrar at the District Conferences.

With conferences around the corner and convention plans already in the making it is time to turn our attention to the business at hand. As a helpful reminder I have listed below the work that should come through your Virginia Division Historian.

Jefferson Davis Historical Gold Medal
Jefferson Davis Historical Silver Medal
Sidney Lanier Medal
Essays
Scrapbooks and Yearbooks
2013 Historian General's Statistical Report

I caution you to review the instructions for each item and follow them to the tee. Do not leave out requested information or do anything other than what is asked for. For example, the single most reason for the Jefferson Davis Historical Gold Medal to be rejected by Historian General has been for improperly filling out the front of the application. When writing why your candidate is eligible for the award be very precise and to the point. Do not write long paragraphs in this space. What you write here will be exactly verbatim what will be printed on the award Certificate. If it is too long or jumbled, your application will be returned with the message, application not properly filled out. If you follow the instructions, your work will go smoother and be approved much faster. Having said that, please do not be discouraged when your applications are returned. Whatever the concerns we can work together to correct or rework it to the benefit of your candidate.

At the close of conferences last year I mentioned that I was going to put extra emphasis on the Historian General's Statistical Report. We will review and discuss how to assure that what work the chapters do will be recorded in such a way as to receive credit for the work and be useful to the Historian General for her review.

Although the Statistical Report will be our focus, the floor will be open for any and all discussions and questions. My regret is that we can only fit a certain amount of exchange into a short period of time. Please remember that I am here to help. My e-mail address is, dixygrl@aol.com

RECORDER of MILITARY SERVICE AWARDS

Chapter submissions of Military Service Award applications are nearly on pace with those received by this time last year - 29 Chapter nominations have been approved by the Recorder General, or are pending. Fourth District Chapters, as hostesses for the 118th Annual Convention, are also striving to fill the slate of candidates for Division bestowals during historical Evening.

I urge members to actively seek out those who have served our country in the military, and challenge each and every Virginia Chapter to order medals and plan award ceremonies as part of the yearly agenda. This is something every Chapter can do – with additional effort and focus, the Division could have 100% participation. We have many award variations, and this affords many opportunities to honor military service over a wide range of years and locations. It bears emphasis that bestowing Military Service Awards truly serves the patriotic objectives of our organization in remembering and esteeming our Confederate Ancestors while recognizing and honoring the valor of their descendants.

Please note that revised Memorandum of Fact forms (Form 6) were approved for use in October, 2012, replacing the 2005 edition of the MOF. The Recorder General will accept submissions on the earlier 2005 forms until 1 July 2013. The new 2012 MOF forms are currently available from the Business Office along with a corresponding updated CD for preparing Military Service and Meritorious Award applications on the computer.

Working with our award forms and reviewing a veteran's discharge papers, or DD214 (active duty service record), involve a slight learning curve and familiarity. Special attention should be paid to the following:

1. Carefully check the nominee's service dates against the award eligibility dates specified on Form 36 for each war, conflict, or armed expedition. Additionally note that for the Korean War, Vietnam Conflict, and Global War on Terror Cross awards, citations for Korean, Vietnam, and GWOT service or campaign medals must also appear on the DD214. Absent these citations or other proof, within the correct eligibility conflict dates, the bestowal is for a National Defense Medal.
2. **Service ranks and unit citations should not be entered on the MOF as abbreviations** since this encoded information is often obtuse and cannot be entered on the bestowal Certificates. The use of abbreviations taken directly from the DD214s is the most common deficiency I see in processing MOFs. Avoid this practice by interviewing the veteran when you receive his, or her, DD214. Rank and unit abbreviations may also be researched and clarified by

inputting them into your computer search engine, or seeking the assistance of military personnel such as that available from recruiting service staffs representing the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard.

I look forward to the opportunity to discuss and answer questions regarding completion of Memorandum of Fact applications for Military Service Awards at the upcoming District Conferences, and I encourage each Chapter Recorder or representative to attend my workshops. FROM FARM GIRLS TO SOLDIERS... AND BACK AGAIN

They were just teenaged girls from Pulaski County in southwestern Virginia, but their bravado and dedication stood as a model to many. Mary and Mollie (or Molly) Bell were cousins, living on the family farms and working hard outside, as did everyone, particularly in wartime. While the whole family had always been Confederate-inclined, at some point the uncle with whom they lived lost his allegiance to the Confederacy and enlisted in a Union regiment.

This appears to have infuriated the two girls, who decided they would join the Confederate Army, and they did. They cut their hair fairly short in the manner used by most young men of the time, and using cloths to bind their chests, and working to "walk like a man" and use a lower voice to speak, they were able to give the appearance of adolescent boys.

"Bob Morgan" and "Tom Parker" appear

Mary became known as Tom Parker, and Mollie assumed the identity of Bob Morgan (or Martin). Most of the men who served with them had no reason to question their validity, and all who would know them stated that they fought hard and were "never known to straggle or shirk duty."

They joined a cavalry unit led by Gen. Jubal Early, and served in it for two years, fighting like men and living like the male soldiers, and apparently arousing no suspicion in those they encountered. As many girls similarly serving had done, they told their secret to their captain, who kept it for them until his capture in 1864, and it was he who gave the information to Gen. Early.

Both are promoted

During their time with the troops, Mary was promoted to Sergeant and Mollie to Corporal. This did not matter to Early when he learned their gender. They were falsely accused of being 'camp followers' or prostitutes, and told they would be put in prison. When they were captured, the Richmond Daily Examiner painted the two brave women in less than flattering terms, but when the Richmond Dispatch got the story, the treatment was extremely positive and the girls described in better terms. The story read as follows in part:

"The central [rail] cars, on Friday night, brought down two girls, namely Mary Bell and Mollie Bell, who were dressed in soldier clothes. They claim to be cousins, and state that before the war they lived with their uncle in Southwestern Virginia; but about two years since he left them and went over to the Yankees..."

After three months; service in the cavalry, they joined the Thirty-sixth Virginia Infantry, and have been with it up to the present time. On one occasion, Mollie killed three Yankees while on picket, and on her return to the brigade was promoted for gallantry to corporalcy. The corporal has missed but one battle – that of Cedar Creek – she having been sent off on duty at the time. Once she was slightly wounded in the arm by a piece of shell.

From the time these girls entered the service up to the day of the fight which took place between Early and [Union General Phil] Sheridan on the 19th instant, the secret of their sex was only known to the captain of the company to which they belonged..."

Early takes action

About this time, the captain himself was taken prisoner, and the girls had lost their protector. It was then that the lieutenant who took over his duties saw fit to report it to the General, and Early promptly ordered them to be transported to Richmond.

It was said that when Early questioned the girls, Mollie volunteered the information that there were six other girls in disguise in his army, but she drew the line at telling him either who they were or where they were.

Their original dispositions apparently showed in the interrogation, as Mollie (Bob Morgan) was the more communicative of the two, and appeared to be a refined,

educated lady, while Mary (Tom Parker) was quieter and had a moody temperament.

The girls were sent to Castle Thunder, until further arrangements could be made "for their welfare," it was said. It was located on Tobacco Row on Cary Street in Richmond, fairly near the famous Libby Prison facility.

This was a filthy, unspeakable prison, designed to hold 1,400 but usually holding 3,000 men and women. Diseases such as dysentery and smallpox raged there, and the conditions were made worse by a cruel, inhuman commandant, Capt. George W. Alexander, to the extent that a Confederate Congress authorized an investigation of it. Stories of severe and unauthorized lashings were frequent and Alexander patrolled holding a large dog-named Nero on a leash, which he threatened the inmates with. The investigation had no effect, and Alexander remained until Dennis Callahan replaced him a year later.

As to Mollie and Mary, they were ultimately released, and no charges were brought against them. Wearing the same "soldier clothes" in which they had been arrested, they returned home to resume their former lives, with many tales of the war with which to regale their friends and neighbors.

Never underestimate the dedication and ferocity of Southern females!

R.E. LEE CAMP HALL MUSEUM

Mary Custis Lee-17th Virginia Regiment Chapter #7

Located at 806 Prince Street, Alexandria, VA, this Greek Revival home was built in 1852 by Rev. James T. Johnston, rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. The red brick, twelve-room house was one of the first in the city to boast gas lighting and running water.

On May 24, 1861, federal forces seized Alexandria. The citizens of the city awoke to find themselves under martial law. The Johnstons escaped to Richmond. Their home, along with many other large houses was confiscated and used as a hospital. It had a maximum capacity of 95 patients and Confederate wounded were housed in the basement. The cell where they were kept still exists. In 1863, the house was purchased at tax sale by Lucius Crittenden, treasurer general of the United States. In an unusual move, after the war, he permitted Rev. Johnston to repurchase the property. Following Rev. Johnston's death, the house passed to his nephew, Col Julius A. DeLagnel, the Hero of the Battle of Rich Mountain (West) Virginia. Col DeLagnel owned the house until 1903.

By the early 1900's the R. E. Lee Camp #2 UCV was looking for a place to call home. The Camp was comprised largely of former members of the Alexandria companies of the 17th Virginia Infantry. The Camp did not have the \$5,300.00 purchase price. However, Camp commander William Smoot (a prosperous lumber merchant) did. He purchased the house and held it in trust until the Camp was able to repay him. The Camp took possession of the property on May 24, 1903 (Confederate Memorial Day in Alexandria).

CORRECT USE of CONFEDERATE FLAGS

When Should We Fly the Flag?



When should we fly the Confederate Flag? One answer is obvious – all the time! However, sometimes that is not practical. So we should, at a minimum, fly the Flag on the days that the Virginia Division recognizes as important ones. I have added a chart below listing these days. Without getting into a discussion about which flag to fly, I would point out that Maury, Davis, Buchanan, and Semmes did not serve in the Confederate Army.

Virginia Division Days of Observance

January 14	Birthday of Commander Matthew Fontaine Maury, CSN
January 19	Birthday of General Robert E. Lee, CSA
January 21	Birthday of General Thomas J. Jackson, CSA
May 30/Last Monday in May*	Confederate Memorial Day
June 3	Birthday of President Jefferson Davis
September 10	Founding of UDC
September 16	Birthday of Admiral Franklin Buchanan, CSN
September 27	Birthday of Raphael Semmes, Rear Admiral, CSN

*Note: Some references list May 30 as Confederate Memorial Day in Virginia although many Chapters hold observances over the last week-end in May.

You might also like to fly the Flag on days important to your ancestors, such as birthdays, date of death, especially if they died during the War. There may be other dates in Confederate history that have particular importance to your family. If your Ancestors did not come from Virginia, you might check out the special days in the other Confederate States.

I would also challenge you to research the person that is being honored. If we are taking the time to remember the person, we should know why!

Information of Note: On May 1, 1863, the Confederate Congress approved a new national flag that we today call the Stainless Banner. A garrison flag measuring 8 feet x 12 feet was commissioned to fly over the Confederate Capitol. Instead, it was draped over General Thomas Jackson's casket as it lay in state in the capitol building. Because of its large size, this flag is not usually displayed. However, on May 11 and 12, 2013, this flag will be on display at the Museum of the Confederacy in Richmond to coincide with the Sesquicentennial Commemoration of the anniversary of the days that it draped Jackson's casket.

Albemarle Chapter is continuing its project of identifying and researching the soldiers buried in the Confederate Cemetery at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville. This cemetery is the final resting place for nearly 1,100 men who served during the War Between the States and died in the Charlottesville General Hospitals.

During the War, the Charlottesville General Hospitals treated soldiers from many major battles, including First Manassas, Port Republic, Cross Keys, and Cedar Mountain. Soldiers from every state in the Confederacy were buried here, often unbeknownst to their families hundreds of miles away.

In 1866, the **Ladies Memorial Association**, a forerunner of the **UDC**, recorded the soldier's information from hospital records and raised \$1,500 to build a wall around the Confederate Cemetery. In 1893, they raised money and erected a monument in the center of the cemetery listing the names and regiments of these brave men who gave their lives for the Confederacy.

Today, the members of **Albemarle Chapter** are researching the soldiers buried in this historic cemetery to learn more about their lives and families before the War.
