It is better to have the Applicant date the checks for the date you will be mailing the Application.

I can photo shop them and hopefully adjust the contrast so they are clearer. Remember if you are using tombstone photos to prove Birth and Death dates – Please write on the photo the name of the Cemetery and city/town/county/ church/ state where it is located. Tombstones do not prove place of Birth or Death. In the Death section you want to put Buried and the location only (Staunton, VA). You will enter on the Proof line "M&F tombstone photos" and then the name and formal location (Christ Church Cemetery, Staunton, VA). You are all awesome!!!! I applaud all of you for your dedication and service. Bless be the tie that binds.

RECORDER of MILITARY SERVICE AWARDS

As of today 55 MOF have been received, 46 have been approved and 9 are pending.

There have been a total of 13 MOF for WWI, 9 for WWII, 14 for Vietnam, 5 for Korea and 3 for Global War on Terror. There have been 27 Crosses, 17 National Defense Medals and 2 Certificates of Appreciation.

A special thank-you goes to all of the chapters who have submitted an MOF and to those who have held meaningful and lovely bestowal ceremonies. The chapters who have not yet submitted an MOF are encouraged to do so this summer. It is a privilege and a pleasure to honor our veterans as we remember their Confederate heritage.

Again, I remind you that all three copies of the MOF must be completed accurately, dated and signed in the appropriate places. A DD214, or the appropriate discharge papers, must accompany the MOF as well as proof of the Confederate ancestry. Acid free paper is required for the original copy and signatures must be original on all copies.

A "Recorder of Military Service Awards Manual" may be obtained from the Business Office for a cost of \$6.00. It includes explicit instructions for completing the MOF. If I can be of any help, please contact me at jfawner@rcn.com or 804-537-5514.

NEWS FROM CHAPTERS

CAPTAIN SALLY TOMPKINS 2626

Captain Sally Tompkins was pleased to present its first Military Service Award to Kenneth Wood, husband of UDC member Gwen Wood. Mr. Wood is Commander of Magruder-Ewell Camp No. 99 Virginia Division Sons of Confederate Veterans in Newport News. He served as a Private First Class in the 1st Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, United States Marine Corps during the Cuban Missile Crisis. His Confederate ancestor is private Edward Stanley Jarrett who served in Company A (Captain J.D. Smith's) Virginia Light Artillery. Jean Frawner presented the award.

Christine Anthony, Theresa Denby and Patricia Miles represented our UDC chapter at the grand opening of Fort Nonsense, Mathews County's newest historical park. Fort Nonsense, represents one of the best preserved Confederate earthworks in the local area. The fort was designed by Lt. William H. Clarke, a Confederate engineer then stationed at Gloucester Point. It was built in the winter of 1861 -1862 and was positioned overlooking the main road leading from Mathews County into Gloucester in order to slow down a potential Federal invasion force from reaching the artillery batteries at Gloucester Point. Our ladies served refreshments to visitors and gave literature out on our UDC Chapter.

For Memorial Day, the members of Captain Sally Tompkins placed a wreath on her grave in memory of her service to the Southern Cause. Attending the ceremony was our 2014 Captain Sally Tompkins scholarship winner, Morganne Roundy. Morganne read her essay on Captain Sally. Morganne is in her second year of a nursing program at Rappahannock Community College.
