Include any Chapter and individual activities or work you know will occur after the forms are completed but before Sept. 1. All reports must be received before the deadlines.

Less than 3 months from now we will be attending Virginia Division Convention in Harrisonburg. We hope you plan to attend as we will be electing Division Officers for 2015-2017. Please know that each member's voice and opinion is important, your vote is your voice, whether it is for Bylaws,

Standing Rules or the election of your Division Officers. Chapter Presidents should inform members of the qualifications of candidates standing for office. Speak up at your chapter meetings, let elected Chapter Delegates and Alternates know how the Chapter's allowed number of votes should be distributed.

Chapter Credentials must be completed and in the hands of our Credentials Chairman, Lynn Willis by or before **September 18th**. You must complete the proxy information. List the person serving as your Chapter's Proxy and be sure the proxy is informed of how the Chapter wishes their vote(s) to be cast. Your Chapter Proxy should have, in writing, who is to cast Chapter vote(s) according to the Chapter's decision just in case Chapter Delegates or Alternates cannot be at Convention. It is important for your voice to be heard. We never know what may happen preventing your Chapter representatives from being able to attend Division Convention.

Thank you, Daughters, for your love, work, dedication and determination for Virginia Division. It is a pleasure to work with each of you. Individual and Chapter efforts are appreciated. HISTORIAN

District Meetings are over, thank you to all the host Chapters I enjoyed being at them all. I'm sure everyone is looking forward to the summer and Yearend Reports. Below are some hints for filling out the **Statistical Requirements for Historian General Awards.**

This two page form I think is one of the most difficult to complete. It asks for a lot of information and copies or lists of what the Chapters are doing. Lists and copies are extra work, but if I don't receive them I can't count the work your Chapter has done.

TROPHIES Page 1: Is Diaries, letters and working with schools and children. Does your Chapter do any work with schools and students please include that work on this page?

ADDITIONAL DATA page 1: The work you are doing to help preserve historic sites should be reported to the Division Committee but also in this section of the Historian's report. Continue to report those grave sites and record the number of cemeteries where they are located in this section.

BANNERS Page 2: The very first question asks for the number of meetings that included the Historian Generals program. I'd like to make a suggestion, have a Historians minute during your meetings. The programs are interesting but you don't need to have a full blown reading of the program. Just an overview will do and maybe interest the members enough to read the full program which is also on line.

When filling out the Statistical Requirements for Historian General Awards; read the questions and if a list is required please include it with your report. Eleven out of twenty-five questions require a list. Question 23; "List other ways that impartial Southern or Confederate causes are presented". This left out by most Chapters; include grave markings, wreath laying at Christmas, anything when you are in the public or the public might hear or be a part of counts as doing something that relates to our Confederate history and please include a list.

Remind your Chapter members to keep a record/list of the fiction and non-fiction Confederate era books they've read.

RECORDER of MILITARY SERVICE AWARDS

Fifty-seven Memorandum of Fact have been processed by the Division Recorder MSA and thirty-nine have been approved by the Recorder General MSA. There were twenty-three World War II Crosses, one Korean Cross, two Vietnam Crosses, two Global War on Terror Crosses, seven Korean National Defense Medals, eight Vietnam National Defense Medals, one Global War on Terror National Defense Medal, two Armed Forces Expeditionary Service Medals and two Certificates of Appreciation.

Credentials

Please remember to send your registrations in before the deadline. Make sure your Chapter Presidents have sent in your Credentials so when you arrive, you will have a vote if you are a Delegate. Your Chapter is entitled to one vote for your first seven members and another vote for every 20 members after that. You are allowed twice as many Alternates as the number of Delegates. Your Credentials form is in your President’s packet your Chapter received at District Conference. The Credentials form is NOT to be copied and must be filled out and returned to me by September 18th. **If your Credentials are not turned in, your Chapter will not have representation at the Convention, and will NOT be allowed to vote on the floor or in the election. Your Chapter’s votes will be lost, and no one can cast them for you.**

Ladies, please make sure you fill out the proxy part of your Credentials as well. Do NOT put your Delegate’s name down as your proxy. If she is there, she has the vote. You have a choice of ANY member in the Virginia Division whose Credentials have been received. Normally, Chapters choose the Virginia Division President, their District Chairman, or a member of another Chapter that will be attending. Remember, if something happens to your Delegate(s) and they are unable to attend, and you have no proxy listed, **your votes will be lost. No one can cast them for you.**

Captain Sally Tompkins 2626

We recently provided refreshments for the Mathews County Sesquicentennial Committee's program by Stan Cardy "Soldiers In Gray". This one man play details a Southern soldier's life before, during, and after the War Between the States. UDC member Martha Ellen Traband underwrote the production as a loving tribute to her late husband Bill Brockner her "Soldier in Gray".

On Memorial Day members met to place wreaths on Captain Sally's grave and on the Mathews County Confederate Monument. New member Helen Beavers received her certificate at lunch and was welcomed into our group.

In March ten members and one prospective member attended the Fifth District Conference held at Stratford Hall, the home of Gen. Robert E. Lee.

At the chapter meeting in April, Mrs. Rebecca Cumins presented a most interesting program on "Richard Kirkland" the angel of Marye's Heights in Fredericksburg, VA. Rebecca works for the National Parks Service and is President of the Confederate Memorial Hall in Louisiana. A resident of the City of Petersburg, Miss Annie was committed to see the general headquarters located in Richmond. A Monument will be erected this summer with dedication to be

August 15 at Blandford Cemetery. Invitations to be mailed out in a few weeks.

Miss Annie served as President of the Petersburg Chapter 155 from 1934-1936 and 1951-1953. She was the Virginia Division President from 1931-1933.

The Petersburg Chapter attended Dinwiddie Days Sesquicentennial at the Historic Dinwiddie Courthouse on March 28th with a bake sale. Other ladies attended the General A. P. Hill Memorial Service, "Where Hill Fell" on April 2nd.

A visit to Weston Manor Plantation, built in 1789, overlooking the Appomattox River in Hopewell, was the selected meeting place for the April meeting.

Our May meeting was held at the Violet Bank Museum in Colonial Heights.

Division Special Committee, "150th Anniversary of the War Between the States"

In 2011, the Virginia Division took on the conservation of the Crenshaw Battery Flag as an appropriate Sesquicentennial project. This Special Committee was stood up to help Division focus on this conservation effort in honor of the '150th Anniversary of the War Between the States'.

One of the things the Committee produced and has provided to each Chapter was a wonderful Historical Program which could be used at an upcoming monthly meetings. The program provides an overview of Captain William B. Crenshaw and his many contributions as a soldier, statesman, and businessman; the Crenshaw Battery and the role those brave soldiers played throughout the entire period of the War Between the States; and some insights into the techniques and expertise required to conserve this piece of Virginia's Southern history. The program will raise awareness about this important conservation effort with all our Sisters across the State.
