The Ellen Elizabeth Snedden Scholarship award criteria were approved at the 2016 Virginia Division Convention in Lynchburg. This scholarship is for those attending vocational-technical schools and community colleges. The Virginia Division Scholarship application will be updated to reflect the new criteria. The updated applications for Virginia Division and UDC General will be distributed to all Virginia chapters in December by both e-mail and regular mail. Appomattox Statue Update- Ms. Debbie Mullins

The members of the Mary Custis Lee-17th Virginia Regiment Chapter #7 in Alexandria, have had some good news regarding the *Appomattox* Statue. The city council voted unanimously to put the request to move the monument to the grounds of the Lyceum in the legislative packet.

However, the Alexandria delegation to the legislature has declined to support this proposal. They did not wish to see their political careers ended over this issue. The offices of Sen. Ebbin and Delegates Herring and Levine were all contacted by our chapter president. All said they have no intention of introducing or supporting this proposal. So, for now, it goes nowhere. Sen. Ebbin's office indicated he would only agree to such a proposal if it was amenable to our chapter. We cannot imagine a scenario under which we would agree. Delegate Herring told the council there is no legal justification for moving *Appomattox*. All that being said, one of the city council members is attempting to make the monument out to be a traffic hazard. It sits at an intersection (literally in the middle of it) which is controlled by stop lights. The speed limit in the area is 25 mph. Most people slow down when they approach. The last time the statue was struck was in 1988. Then, it was by a drunk driver. We thank everyone for their support. We will monitor this. We do not believe our fight is over.

It feels great to kick off our fall monthly meetings again. At our Sept 21 meeting we welcomed new member Dinah Balderson based on the service record of her Great-Great Grandfather Alexander Edward Wyant of Rockingham County VA. Corporal Wyant served with the 10th Regiment, Co. I and was killed at Chancellorsville on 3 May 1863.

Virginia Convention was a lot of fun. Seeing friends from across the State and meeting new ladies is such a treat! Thanks to everyone that supported our 'Southern Entertainment' raffle, a fundraiser to support the last phase of our monument work in Northumberland County. Thanks to Katherine Starbuck for drawing the lucky winner, Lynn Reed, 1st District Chair! Our Oct 19th Pot Luck Dinner meeting was at the lovely home of Hilary Derby in Lottsburg. Hilary then presented the program, based on her original research, "*What Was Going on at Walnut Point During the War*" which can be seen from her riverfront home. Our "Monument Ladies" are working three efforts. (1) To document and publish the research supporting the additional 110 Confederate veterans added to the Lancaster County Confederate Monument in May 2016; (2 & 3) Having generated the first ever compilation of all potential men that served from Northumberland County, they are researching each name to prove Service and residency of the men from this list. Once the criteria has been met, the Chapter plans to display these names estimated to be 400+ names at the site of the Northumberland County Confederate monument in Heathsville in 2017. Confederate Graves Lead, Laura Hazel and the "Grave Gals" are working

on the last of the names of the CSA graves located in Northumberland County. This project started on Veterans Day in 2015 and to date over 290 graves have been located and of those 230 have had the paperwork submitted to UDC. Then, we plan to cross over the river in order to identify and register CSA grave site in church, public and family graveyards in Lancaster County.

Registrar, Jude Degen, is working on several membership applications. Recorder of Military Service Awards, Jo Fickling, is planning multiple awards for a March 11, 2017 ceremony.

From August - October, members have attended and/or participated in the following: Sept 10 - Southern Heritage Day, Ft. Nonsense Park, in Mathews County; Sept 16 - Essex County National POW/MIA Recognition Day; Oct 6-9 - Virginia Division Convention in Lynchburg; and Oct 22 - 2nd Virginia Cavalry, Co C, Botetourt Dragoon Flag Dedication in Appomattox. Keeping the faith in the Northern Neck.

Currently the original flag is in storage at the former Museum of the Confederacy in Richmond. In June 2015 our chapter had the pleasure to visit the museum and view the flag. We are delighted and honored to have this piece of Princess Anne history depicted on our chapter pin. Currently, we are working on several grave markers and hope to complete the process for these this fall. In December, we will once again donate gifts and make cookies for Vetshouse , a local rehabilitation program which provides temporary housing and assistance to our local veterans that are in need of help. Do you know? A Moment in Confederate History

Mrs. Fitzhugh Lee, née Ellen Bernard Foule, born January 26, 1863 in Alexandria, Virginia, died June 18, 1933. Her parents' came from prominent families of Massachusetts and Virginia. She married General Fitzhugh Lee in 1871 in Alexandria at the age of eighteen and the union produced seven children. She became a member of the Mary Custis Lee Chapter in 1896. In that same year, she became the President General of the United Daughters of the Confederacy. During her Presidency, a committee formed to decide how to bring the members of the Grand Division of Virginia into the UDC. Mrs. Lee was the guest in the home of Mrs. George Brown in Philadelphia where the first chapter north of the Mason and Dixon Line formed. Her Corresponding



Secretary, Katherine Mason Rowland, assisted in the organization of a New York Chapter and the creation of the Missouri Division. Education became key to her administration by addressing the importance of education for poor girls of the South. She organized an Education Committee to ensure that Children's Chapters were taught Southern history, as well as in schools. Illness kept Mrs. Lee from presiding over the General Convention and Mrs. Louise Sophie Wright presided.

In 1901, the Kansas City Chapter made Mrs. Lee an Honorary member. When the United Confederate Veterans had their reunions in Richmond, Virginia, she always attended as an honored guest.

Because of her husband's career, she lived in various cities of Virginia and then in Cuba. She was the First Lady of Virginia when her husband was Governor. She lived in Lexington and then in Lynchburg when her husband was appointed the Internal Revenue Collector. Cuba became her new home when he was made United States Consul General. She is buried beside her husband at Hollywood Cemetery in Richmond, Virginia.

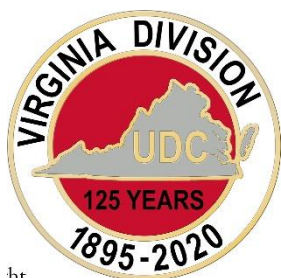
