The latest Insignia Forms, Engraved and Non Engraved are on the General Website under “Forms.” In addition, they will be in the Chapter Packets. They all say “Revised – November 2016.” When I printed off the Engraved Form, the date did not show at the bottom. I have talked to the Vice President General, Mrs. Frances Woodruff, and she has assured me she will accept the forms with no date at the bottom if they are the newest forms. We also discussed the matter of delays in shipping the engraved insignia. The problem continues to be with our engraver. Mrs. Woodruff and Shannon Baker, the Insignia person at the Business Office, are working hard to get the problem resolved. Please be patient and be assured the problem is not with the UDC. Now, for the good news: Virginia Division’s 125 Anniversary Pin was approved and can now be ordered. The form is in the last Old Dominion Bulletin and I am sure it will be in this one also. The cost is \$45.00 and includes shipping. We should have the pins to ship in four weeks. Also, four chapter pins were approved and Virginia Division Great Great Granddaughters Pin was approved. I am waiting on the Letter from General so they can be ordered. Chapter Vice Presidents, please read over the instructions on the Engraved Insignia and Non Engraved Insignia forms carefully. If there are proofs needed for ordering, make sure they are with the order. At the top of the forms: on the left side at the top is the person the order will be shipped to, beneath that is the Chapter Vice President’s signature. On the right side at the top is the Member for whom the insignia is being ordered, beneath that is the Division Vice President’s signature. If the first three parts are not filled in, it has to go back to the Chapter Vice President. This takes more time for the process. - Narrative Reports are **11 point font size** and single-spaced, as well as written in **Times New Roman, preferably in Microsoft Word**. If you do not have Microsoft Word, you can always send me your narrative in the **body of an e-mail**. The same applies to your Officers.
- Even when Chapter Officers remain the same, please highlight in red or blue any changes in e-mail, telephone numbers or addresses.

- If you have **questions**, my e-mail is fairfaxbelle@earthlink.net. You can always contact me at my e-mail address no matter where I am. I will answer you within 24 hours normally. Send reports electronically to that e-mail address (cc: your District Chairman) when you send your written copies to the District Chairman.
- Please use only the forms which come in your packets. They do change from year to year. Do not use outdated forms. If you wish to have the packet in electronic form, e-mail me and I will send it to you electronically.
- Chapter Narratives are **300** words or less. If you send more, you leave it to me to have to decide what to put in and what to leave out, which may not be what you would have left out.

Thank you all for the work that you do. I am awed when I read the amount accomplished each year and honored to be able to report it in your Virginia Division Minutes. Every Officer in each Chapter should have a copy of the VA Div. Minutes at hand to be able to contact her Division Officers and Committee Chairmen. In our November meeting, we were very pleased to have one member, Carolyn Davis, bestowed with a SCV Ladies Appreciation Medal and Certificate of Appreciation for her remarkable work with the Appomattox Juniors Children of the Confederacy. The citation given with this award was: "Carolyn Lee C. Davis, 3rd Vice President of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, District 3, Appomattox Chapter 11, has distinguished herself by outstanding service as Director of Appomattox Juniors Chapter 32, Children of the Confederacy. Under her tutelage, Appomattox Juniors Chapter 32 was awarded Superior Chapter Honors at the Children of the Confederacy 61st Annual General Convention in Lynchburg, Virginia (2015), an event she helped organize. Additionally, at that Convention, Appomattox Juniors Chapter 32 was recognized and rewarded for gaining the most new members on a percentage basis and having the most members of any Chapter attending the Convention." During the 80th Annual Virginia

Children of the Confederacy Division Convention in Fairfax, Virginia (2016), 3 members of the Appomattox Juniors Chapter 32 were elected to statewide office in the Children of the Confederacy. Six first place awards were given to the Chapter in competitions including poetry and artwork, and a member was awarded "Most Outstanding Boy". The Chapter is currently making preparations to host the 81st Annual Virginia Division in Appomattox, Virginia in 2017. The November Holiday Luncheon meeting was held at the home of the President, at which time, over 500 pounds of paper products were collected for the Fisher House at the Veterans' Hospital in Richmond. Angela Smith, Historian, Caroline Grays Chapter, presented an interesting program on "Toys from the 1860's." Each member participated in making Prairie Dolls with materials provided by the speaker. The speaker had on display a sample of Depression Dolls which the disabled soldiers from the WBTS made to sell for a penny each to earn some spending money. Some of the original dolls are on display at the Smithsonian Institute. In December, author, "Bo" Traywick gave a presentation on his book, "The Death and Destruction of the Mother of States and Statesmen." He gave a contemporaneous portrait of Old Virginia, her unwavering stance on State sovereignty and her fight to the death to defend the fundamental principal upon which the Republic was founded. In addition to a short Memorial Service for Gen. Robert E. Lee, Gen. "Stonewall" Jackson and Commodore Matthew Fontaine Maury, by the chapter historian, Cynthia Ledbetter. The speaker, Ben Cleary, historian and author, presented a program on Gen. Thomas J. (Stonewall) Jackson on the date of Gen. Jackson's 193rd birthday. Chapter members attended the ceremony at the Virginia State Capitol commemorating the birthdays of Gen. 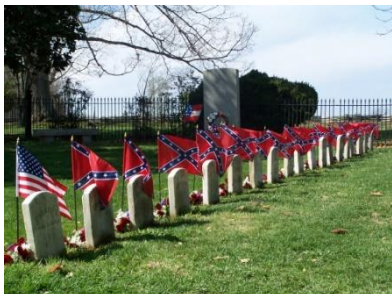
Did You Know?

Do you remember that Kate Mason Rowland and other members worked hard to get the term “War Between the States” to describe those turbulent years? There is a wonderful brochure published in 1954 that explains it in detail. Here is an excerpt from the brochure: “The Congress of the United States used the term “War Between the States” in two measures enacted into law; one measure became Public Law 834 in 1950, and a Resolution, H. 580, was adopted by the House in 1944. The term “War Between the States” has been used in various reports on bills during the 70th, 71st, 72nd, 74th, 80th and 81st. Congresses.

The fact that for four years the Confederacy maintained an entirely separate government (with its own currency, commerce, army and navy) established the Confederate States of America as a separate nation.” For additional information from the brochure, members can purchase it from the UDC Memorial Building.

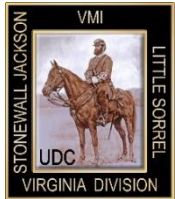
