

## The Poem

### The Statue

Was found the soldier who wore the grey.

A STATUE, linking the heavens with the Earth;  
The form of that Hero to whom our nation gave  
birth;  
Who follow'd on where Honor led,  
Till he rested with our holy dead;  
And when at the last the trumpet's blast  
Sends forth that call that comes to all,  
As an honor guard on that last day  
We'll find the soldier who wore the gray.
